William Henry always dreamed of retiring and owning his own peach orchard. After serving as the Dean of Agriculture at the University of Wisconsin for 30 years, he set out to achieve his goal, almost settling in Georgia. Instead, in 1904, he built Blue Hills Orchard on 318 acres in Wallingford, CT. Today, Eric Henry is the fifth generation of the Henry Family and still running those 318 acres. Eric attended the University of Massachusetts and majored in agriculture.

After graduating in 1989, it only seemed natural to continue the family tradition. In 2009 he was awarded "Young Farmer of the Year" by the Connecticut Department of Agriculture. Blue Hills Orchard is one of Connecticut's largest orchards growing over 20 varieties of apples and a variety of peaches, nectarines, and pears.
